יהוה אל - Jehovah EL - The LORD God - self-existent, almighty, powerful, strong

רחום - rakh-oom' - merciful, compassionate, full of mercy

חנון - khan-noon' - gracious

אף ארך - aw-rake' af - literally "long-nosed" long-suffering, slow to anger, patient

רב חסד - rab kheh'-sed - abundant, abounding, exceeding, full of goodness, kindness, favor

רב אמת - rab eh'-meth - abundant, abounding exceeding, full of truth, trustworthiness, stability
